A ranking system is used to assign points. The highest ranking applicant will be scheduled on the Triennial Calendar.  Gender(s) of participants is an aspect that shall be taken into account as well as the primary type of event, age range(s) of participants and whether even is professional, amateur, or pro-am.	C) Diversity of north shore calendar events - the prevalence of events shall be considered in scoring events with a goal of including a broad range of events within the calendar. The following aspects shall be taken into account:  (i) Primary type of event  (ii) Age range(s) of participants iii) Whether event is professional amateur, or proam  (iv) Gender(s) of participants For the evaluation of event diversity, all applications will be grouped based each of the above criteria. Explanation  To change points system to award higher points for events that provide equitable opportunity for surfers of all genders.	(i) Three points will be assigned to events that fall below the 25th percentile of all applications for the season (For example, if 20 percent of applications are open only to youth, then these events will each receive three points for this criterion.) (ii) Two points will be assigned to events that fall within the 25th percentile to 74th percentile of all applications for the season; and (iii) One point will be assigned to events that fall above the 74th percentile of all applications for the season. The scores for this category shall be equally weighted so that the total score for this category comprises 10 percent of the final score.

This requirement does not apply if:  (i) The sports activity is limited to one gender;  (ii) The rules governing a particular sports activity expressly prohibit the participation of a particular gender; and  (iii) Permits are made available on an equal basis for a similar activity with participants of another gender or to participants  Of all genders.
